## What's on

The marquee will again be on Petersfield Green, packed with craft stalls. Outside will be more stalls and the mysterious, meditative labyrinth. Walk through to **Anglia Ruskin University** for a warm, lively welcome to the fair's biggest indoor venue, featuring children's activities, exhibitions, dance and music.

**Donkey Common** will have a mix of market and craft stalls, as well as a fire pit offering the chance for a warm meet-up and chat. A fire engine will be parked alongside, on Mortimer Road, so you can have a close look and talk to the crew.

Ditchburn Gardens will have two marquees with a mix of stalls, a music stage and a warm café inside. Nearby, the Cambridge Mosque on Mawson Road and the **Salvation** Army Hall on Tenison Road will host activities.

The food fair will be based in the Gwydir Street Car Park. on St Barnabas Road and in the access road to the new Ironworks (formerly the council depot site). Visit this new venue and find out about Ironworks. There will be two fabulous music stages in this part of the fair: in the former Lloyds Bank Car Park and at Ironworks, so you

can eat, drink and linger to enjoy the music and stalls. Nearby, there will be more indoor stalls and activities in St Barnabas Church. to the rear in the St Barnabas Centre, in the Bath House, at the David Parr House Visitor Centre, and down the steps beside the bridge at Railway House.

**Great Eastern Street Car Park** will be taken over by Extinction Rebellion and, opposite, the **Argyle Street** Housing Co-op (ASH) will host their usual lively music stage and stalls.

Camcycle will set up a pop-up park, with refreshments from local cafés, in the heart of the fair at Romsey Parade, Cambridge 105 will broadcast live from a stage outside Tesco, and the Thirstybus will be at Hope Street Yard.

The fair's HQ will be at Mill Road Baptist Church, with information about how to get involved next year. St Philip's Church is planning a fabulous

programme of indoor, family-friendly events and activities.

> Back by popular demand, the Shake Your Tail Feather stage can be found on the corner of Thoday Street, and the Salisbury Club will be open for interactive activities arranged by Cambridge Hands-On Science.

Please continue to the warm welcome at Romsey Mill, which will host the annual Art Show, along with creative and festive activities for all the family.

But the best of the fair is always the street performances. There are 14 busking spots and the usual brilliant circus performers, dancers and poets at intervals along the street.

 Event Control and First Aid are both located in the Baptist Church, 178 Mill Road, on the corner of Stockwell Street - see map overleaf.

### Missing children

 Please arrange your own family meeting point in case you become separated. Report missing children to any steward or Event Control.

### **Road closure**

- Between 9.00am and 5.30pm on the day, Mill Road (between East Road and Coleridge Road), the top of Gwydir Street and the top of St Barnabas Road will all be closed to traffic (including cyclists), although activities will stop at 4.15pm. Diversions will be signposted. Pedestrians should exercise particular care before the road is fully closed. Re-opening will occur gradually, so drivers
- and pedestrians should take extreme care.
- Pedestrians will be required to make way for

emergency and other vehicles within the closure area, from time to time.
